But when you're in the business of Have Music Will Travel, you can't spend all your working hours writing for the more glamorous business of screen dramas.


When he dropped in for a coffee with me this week, he was somewhat chipper about his latest composition, Travel Into The Future, a

seven-minute corporate film which will not be seen by the general public.

"It's a project commissioned by Federal Airports Corporation showing company executives and politicians its proposal for a third runway at Sydney Airport," Art said.

"They wanted to show how this would upgrade air traffic facilities and needed a musical background that was uplifiting and futuristic.

"I was called on Friday to write the entire score by Wednesday. I worked right through the last five days with hardly any sleep and they got it on time. And I'm rather proud of what I delivered."
