


If you are a fan of historical reality shows that take people back in time to live like their ancestors, then Australia has a show for you: *Outback House* gives people an opportunity to recreate life on the Australian Outback in 1861. A group of people return to Oxley Downs, a fully-operational sheep station, to experience what the











The style of the music leans toward a mixture of Vangelis, James Horner and a little bit of Hans Zimmer. There are many fine touches, including a nice arrangement of "Amazing Grace." The melodic ideas have a period feel, even if the fully orchestrated renditions do not. "1861 Lament" employs a gentle "violin" melody that sounds like some distantly remembered folk song. Though it's not a quote, the melodic contour is similar to a theme from *Braveheart*. That Horner-esque style of synth string writing is attractive and appropriate for this production. There are also great Western-sounding moments in the score, in addition to a fine main theme in tracks like "Big Country" and "Sheep Shearing." "Homesick" is one of several standout tracks written for solo guitar and basic string accompaniment.
